I want my art to help people see and experience the world with a more critical vision and with more appreciation of the beauty in the world.

I enjoy photographing a subject and bring out the essential elements so that even a child can appreciate the results.

I would advise aspiring artist understand your self, identify your unique vision and what manner of expression brings out your passions.

My first piece of art was 'Blue like you' - a study of glass, form and texture in a sunny old double hung kitchen window. It won first place at the illinois art league member show in 2009.

My proudest and most memorable achievement was being asked to prepare 60 photographs for "Community Connections" with pottery artist Sandra McKenzie Schmitt at the Peoria Art Guild in 2009. It received the largest opening exhibit attendance for any exhibit up to that time.

My most humbling moment was receiving best of show at the Illinois Art League member show in 2012.


